*** MEDIA ADVISORY *** <u>Reagan Foundation to Award \$50,000</u> <u>in College Scholarships to</u> <u>Ventura High School Seniors</u>

The Ronald Reagan Presidential Foundation is pleased to announce its twelfth year of the *Reagan Presidential Foundation Scholars Program*. This scholarship program honors President Reagan's lasting legacy of leadership each year by rewarding deserving seniors graduating from Ventura County high schools who have demonstrated qualities of leadership and strong character throughout their four years of high school.

\$50,000 in scholarships will be distributed to twelve local leaders with college scholarships ranging from \$2,500 to \$7,000. Awards are designated for tuition, books, and room and board only. In addition, the top 2 students will select a teacher of their choice to receive \$500 for use within their classroom. Scholarships will be paid in full within the year awarded directly to the college of the scholar's choice.

Students designated as Reagan Presidential Foundation Scholars will be invited, with their families, to a dinner at The Reagan Library in May 2011, when the \$50,000 worth of scholarship funds will be awarded.

For the first time since the Reagan Presidential Foundation Scholars Program was instituted, applicants will complete the entire application process online at <u>www.reaganfoundation.org/scholarships</u>. Applications must be completed no later than 5:00 p.m. on March 18, 2011 to qualify.

In addition, the Ronald Reagan Presidential Foundation, in partnership with GE, is launching a new national scholarship program to commemorate the Centennial of President Reagan's birth.
