STATEMENT BY FRED RYAN, CHAIRMAN OF THE BOARD OF THE RONALD REAGAN PRESIDENTIAL FOUNDATION AND INSTITUTE ON THE DEATH OF GEORGE P. SHULTZ



Simi Valley, California – The Reagan Foundation mourns the loss of George P. Shultz, an American Statesman, who served our country with distinction as a Secretary of State, Secretary of the Treasury and Secretary of Labor. He was also a Trustee of the Ronald Reagan Presidential Foundation and Institute since 1989.
