RONALD REAGAN CENTENNIAL CELEBRATION WINS PRWEEK AWARD FOR BEST NON-PROFIT CAMPAIGN

(SIMI VALLEY, Calif.) – On March 1, 2012, PR Week honored the Ronald Reagan Presidential Foundation, awarding it the "Nonprofit Campaign of the Year" for the Ronald Reagan Centennial Celebration, a historic, year-long celebration during 2011 commemorating the 100th birthday of our nation's fortieth president.

"It is the highest accolade in the public relations industry, conferred each year on the best corporate, nonprofit, agency, and education teams, and the work they produce. There are only 33 trophies awarded every year, so each one counts," Steve Barrett, editor-in-chief of PRWeek wrote on their website about the awards.
