# **Introducing the Center on Civility and Democracy**

Americans of all political persuasions are frustrated with the deep divisions and increased polarization that is dividing our country and putting our democracy at risk.

The Ronald Reagan Presidential Foundation & Institute has launched the <u>Center on Civility</u> <u>and Democracy</u> to work with organizations across America to promote civil discourse, help us to find common ground and advance our democracy through informed patriotism. We will follow President Reagan's example of reaching across the aisle, despite political differences, to promote the interests of all Americans and make our country stronger.

This, the first of our quarterly newsletters, focuses on false information, which is a major contributor to the divisions and distrust in America. With the election just weeks away, it is essential that all Americans have access to accurate information as we make our decisions. Foreign actors and some domestic groups are pumping out false and deceptive information at a scale that we have not seen before. Their goal is to confuse and mislead voters, further dividing us and portraying to the world that democracy is a flawed form of government.

We have been at work to raise awareness of this threat by <u>convening experts</u> and bipartisan conversations with elected officials, scholars, and experts. We've also published <u>a simple one-page document</u> that we can share with our family and friends to alert them to the risks of receiving and passing on false information.

# Confronting the threat of cyber influence campaigns on our democracy

This year is monumental for the world's democracies, with more than 2 billion people voting in elections of consequence. Here in the U.S., the presidential election is just weeks away. These elections are taking place in a time of global uncertainty and rapid technological advancements, particularly with the rise of Artificial Intelligence (AI) in consumer spaces. This is all taking place against the backdrop of continuous cyber influence campaigns by foreign nations.

The use of propaganda to mislead and deceive people is not new. From wartime propaganda to yellow journalism, the battle to discern the truth has always been crucial for democratic resilience. However, modern and adversarial nation-state influence campaigns pose a heightened threat to the integrity of our democratic processes and the trust citizens place in their institutions. As we navigate this evolving information environment, it's crucial to understand these challenges and take proactive steps to build a more resilient society.


#### Watch the Conversation ▶
