This year's RISE, themed "Igniting the Flickering Spark," will convene education stakeholders, policy leaders, scholars, and innovators from a range of viewpoints to address the most pressing issues in education today—from student mental health and academic recovery to higher education reform and the future of work.

"All eyes are on states—not Washington—to chart new paths toward economic opportunity for today's students," said Dr. Ellen Dollarhide McCoy, Associate Director of the Ronald Reagan Institute's Center for Civics, Education, and Opportunity. "President Reagan had an enduring belief in the power of education to unlock opportunity, strengthen civic life, and prepare the next generation. We are bringing together leaders who are doing the hard work of 'igniting the flickering spark of knowledge' to ensure an education system that meets our nation's future."
