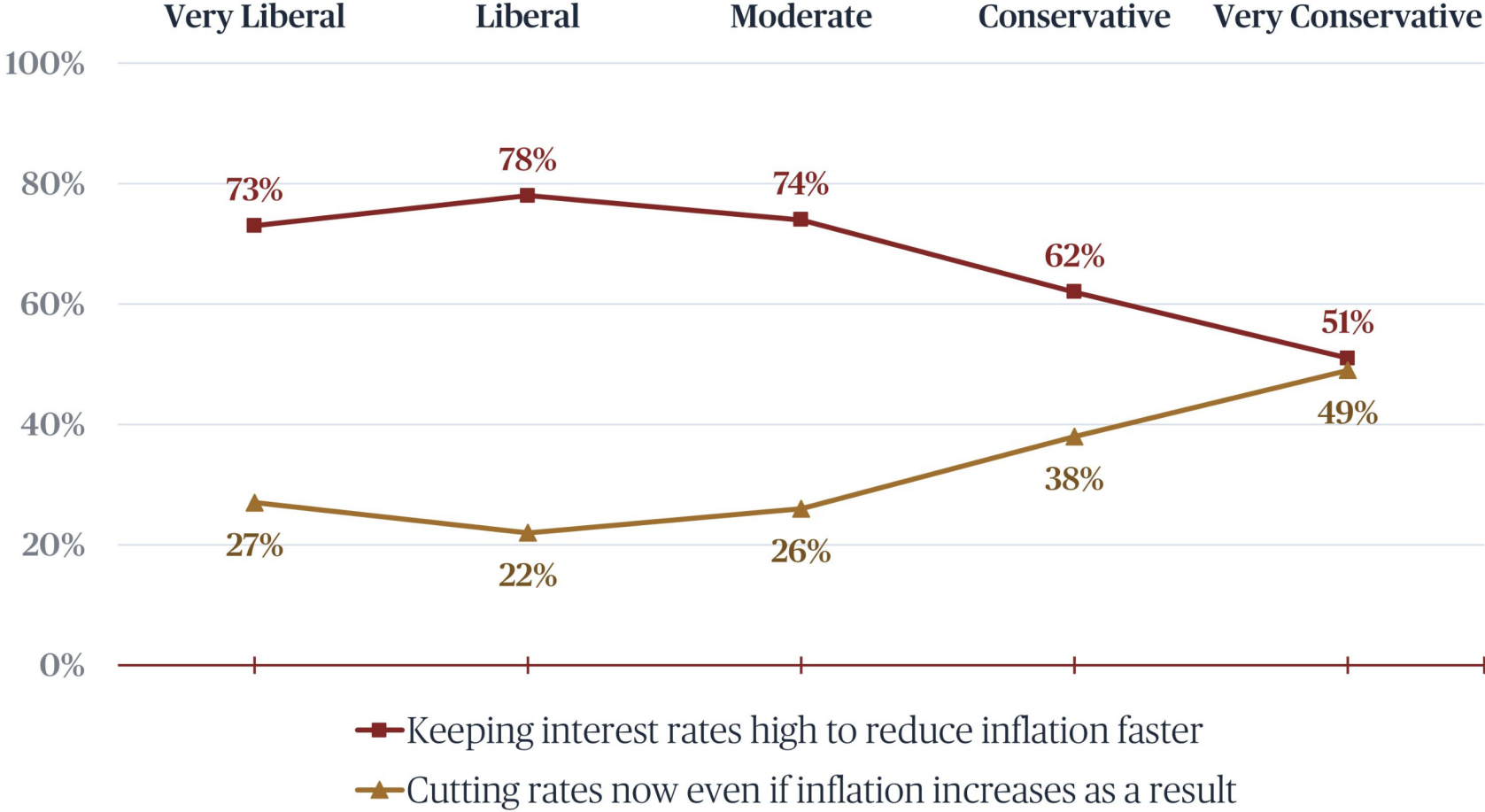

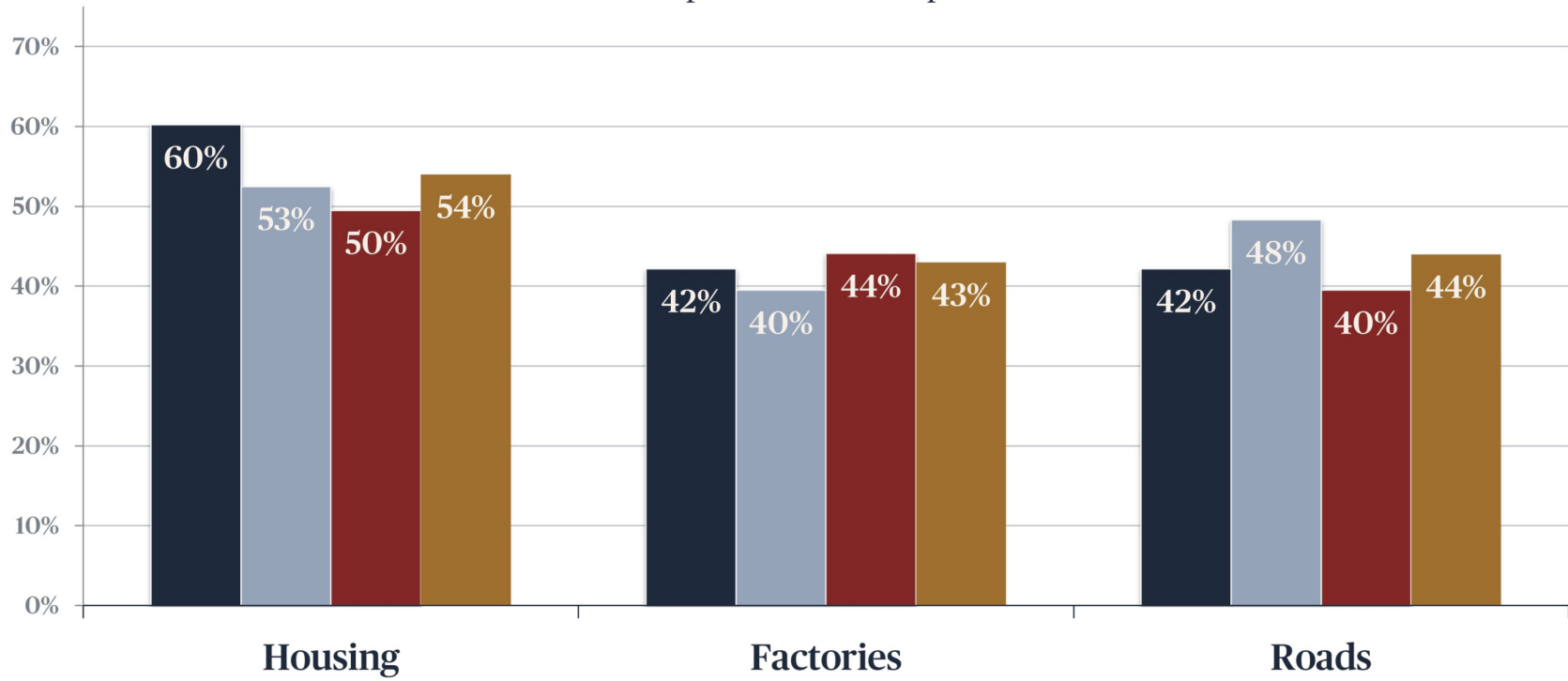

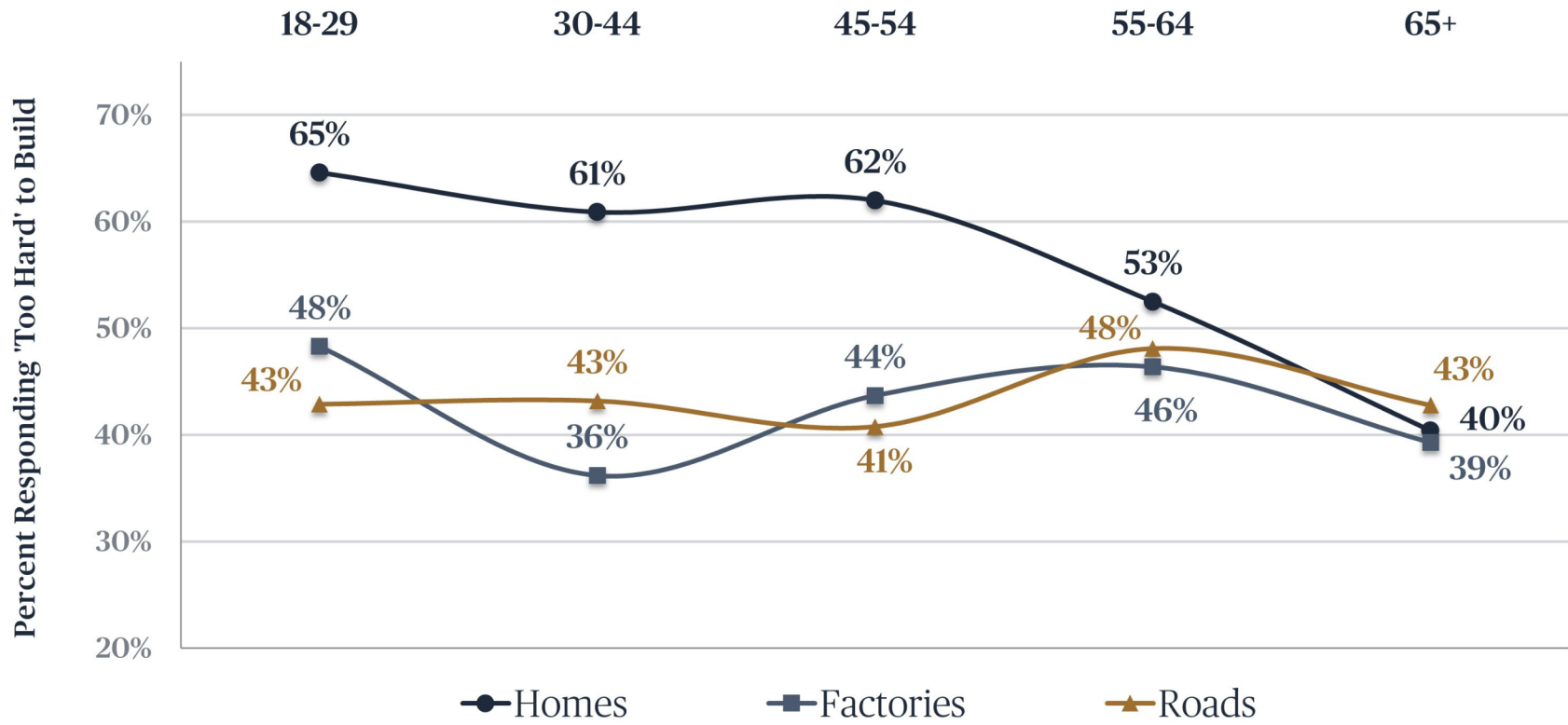


Respondents Indicating "Too Hard" to Build

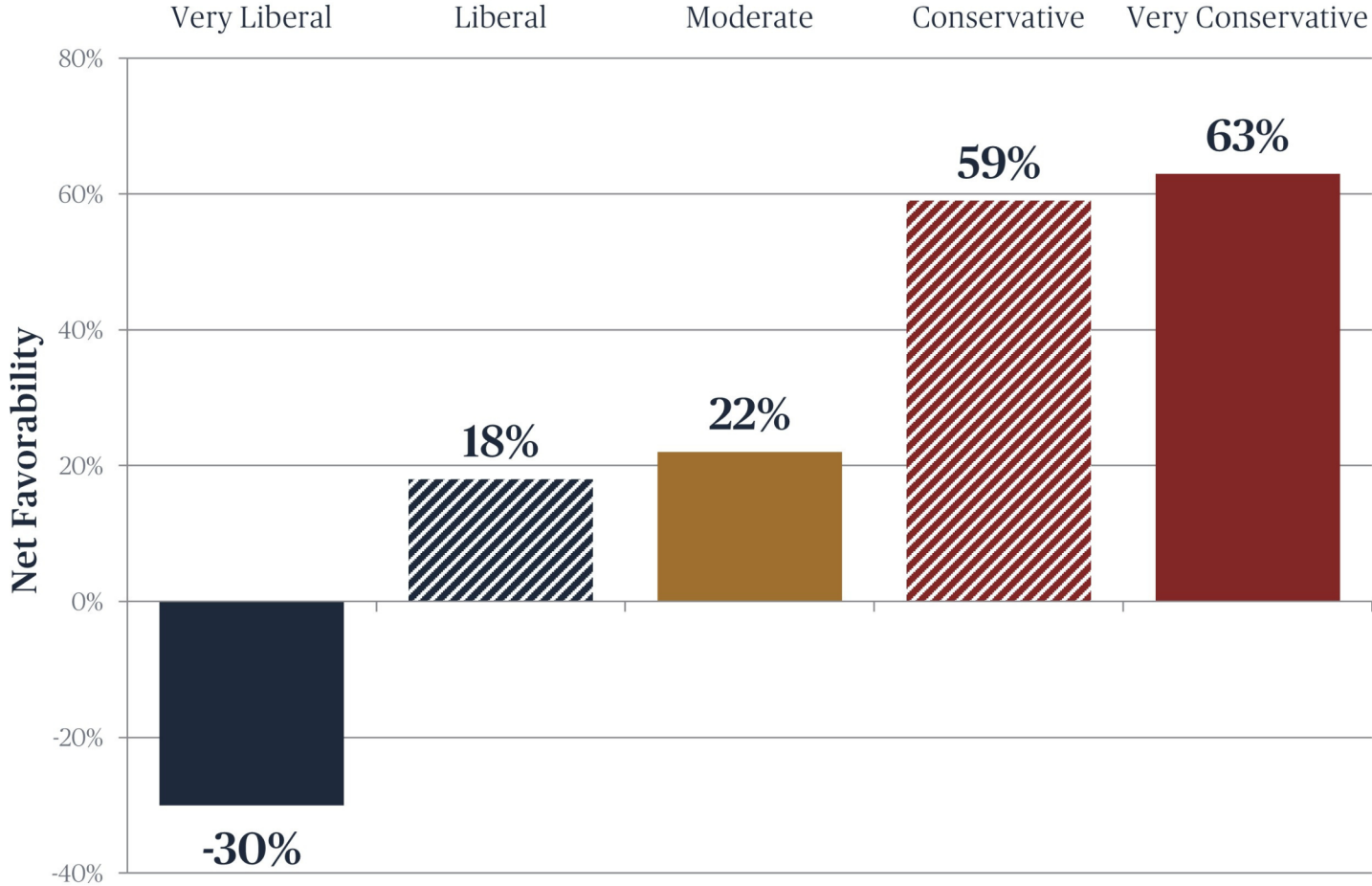

"Too Hard" to Build Perception by Age

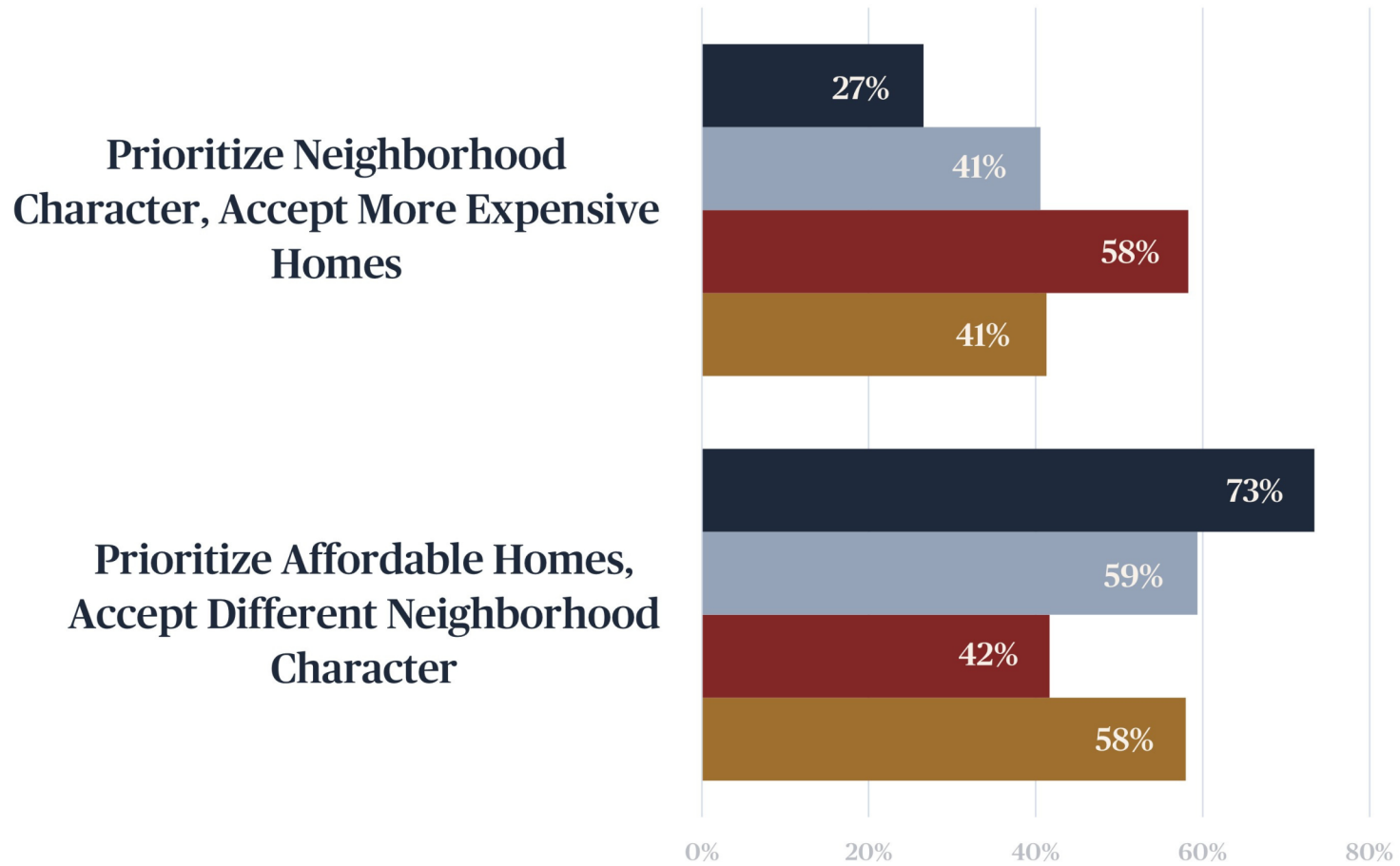


Net Favorability of Speeding Up Permit Approval Process for Factory Construction



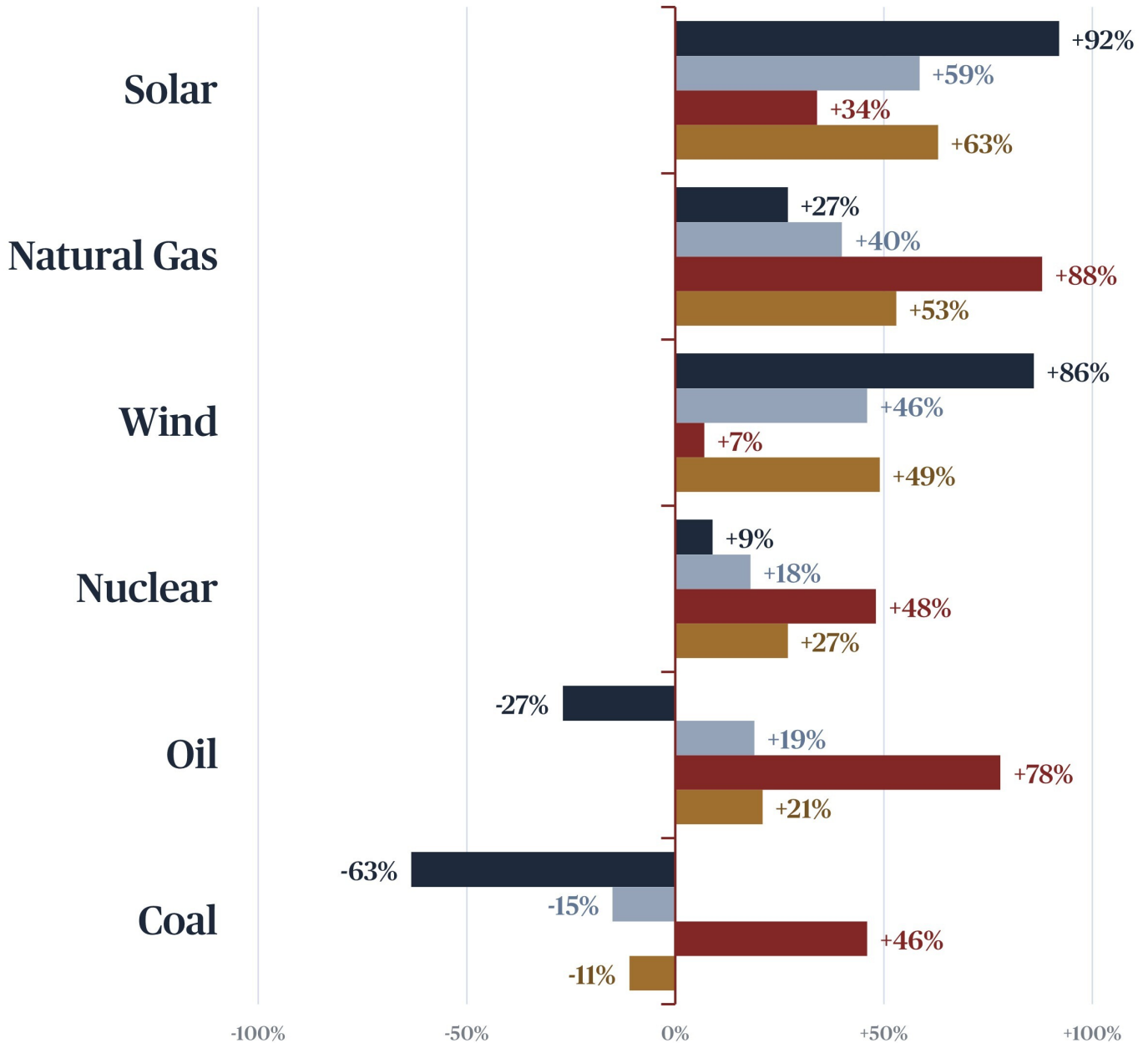

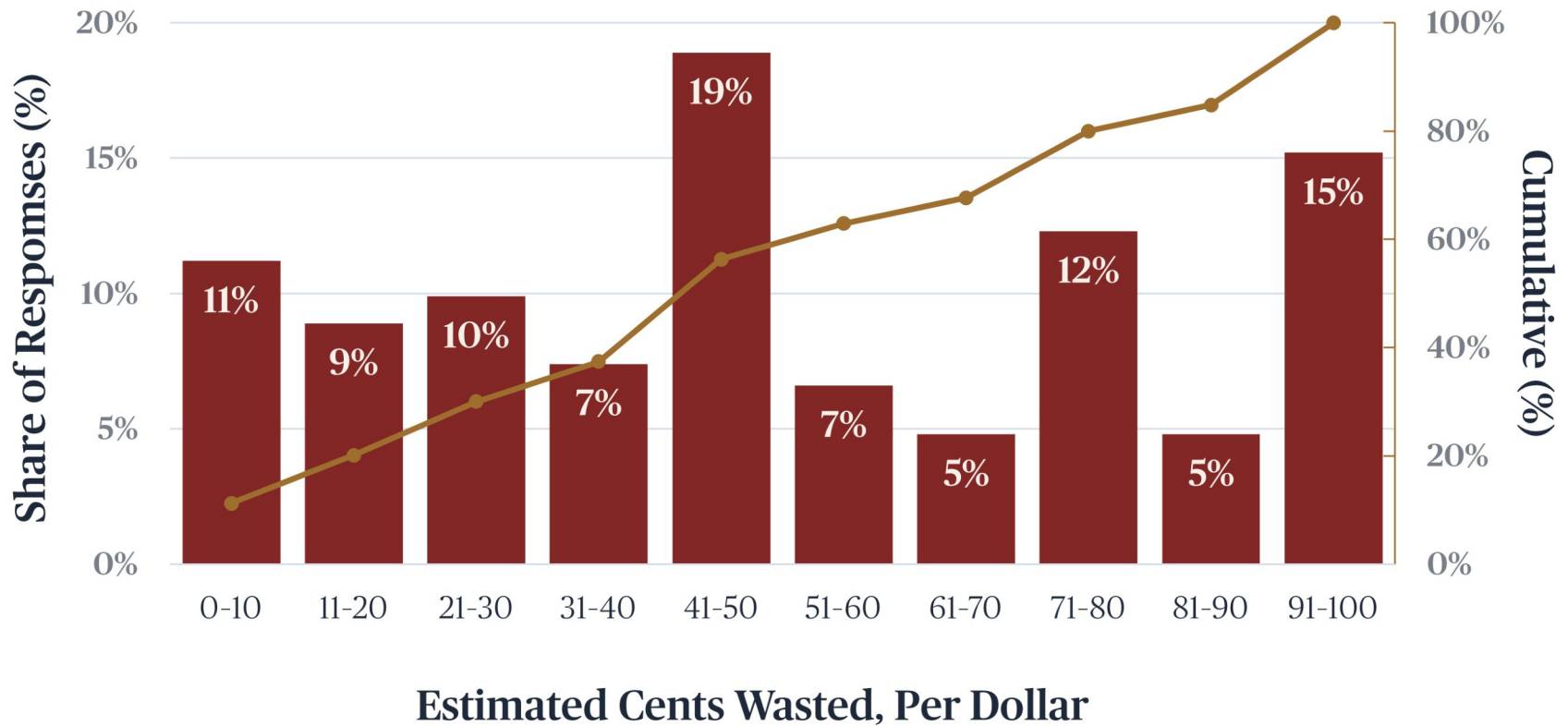


Net Favorability of Energy Sources by Party

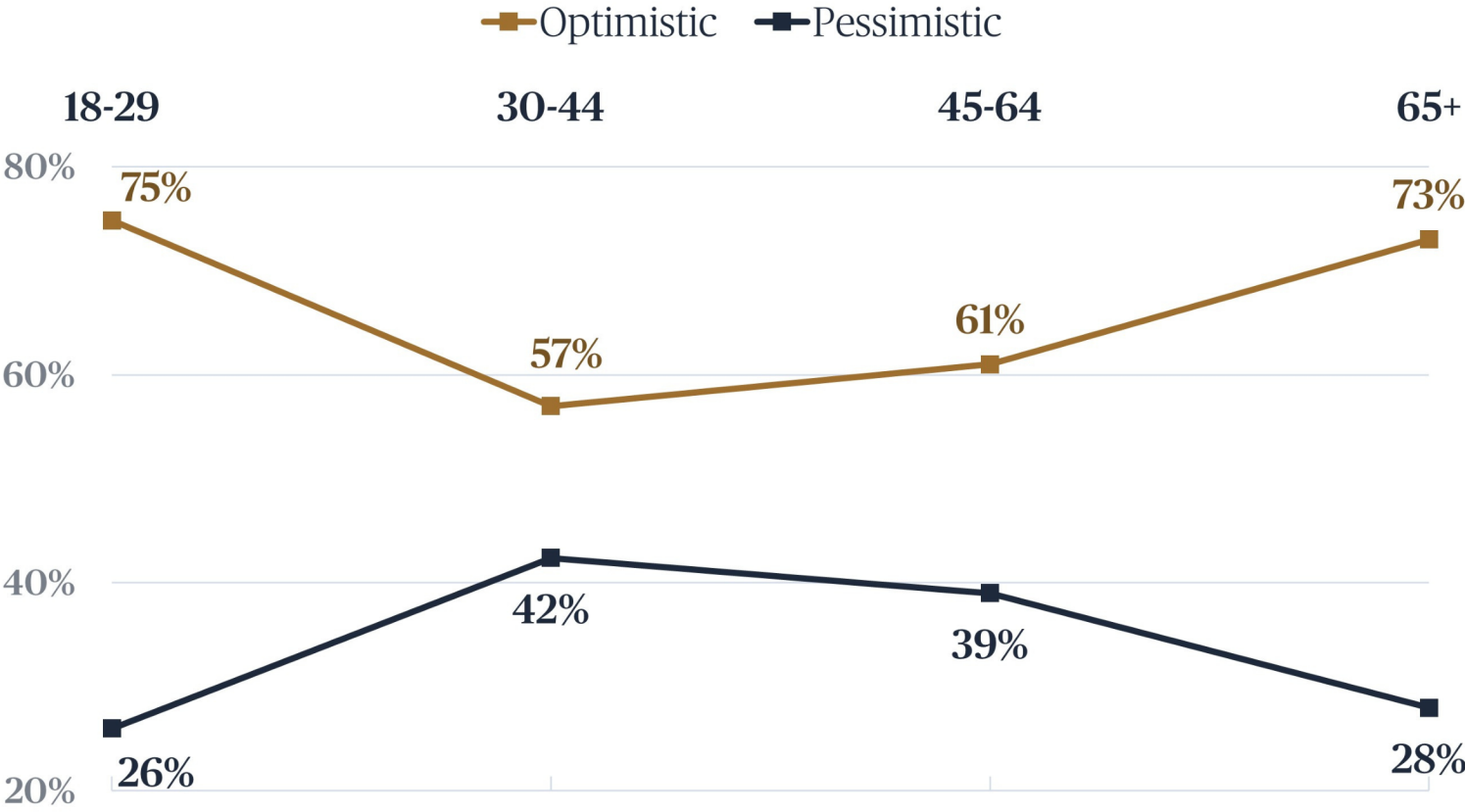

Perceived Amount of Waste in U.S. Federal Government Spending

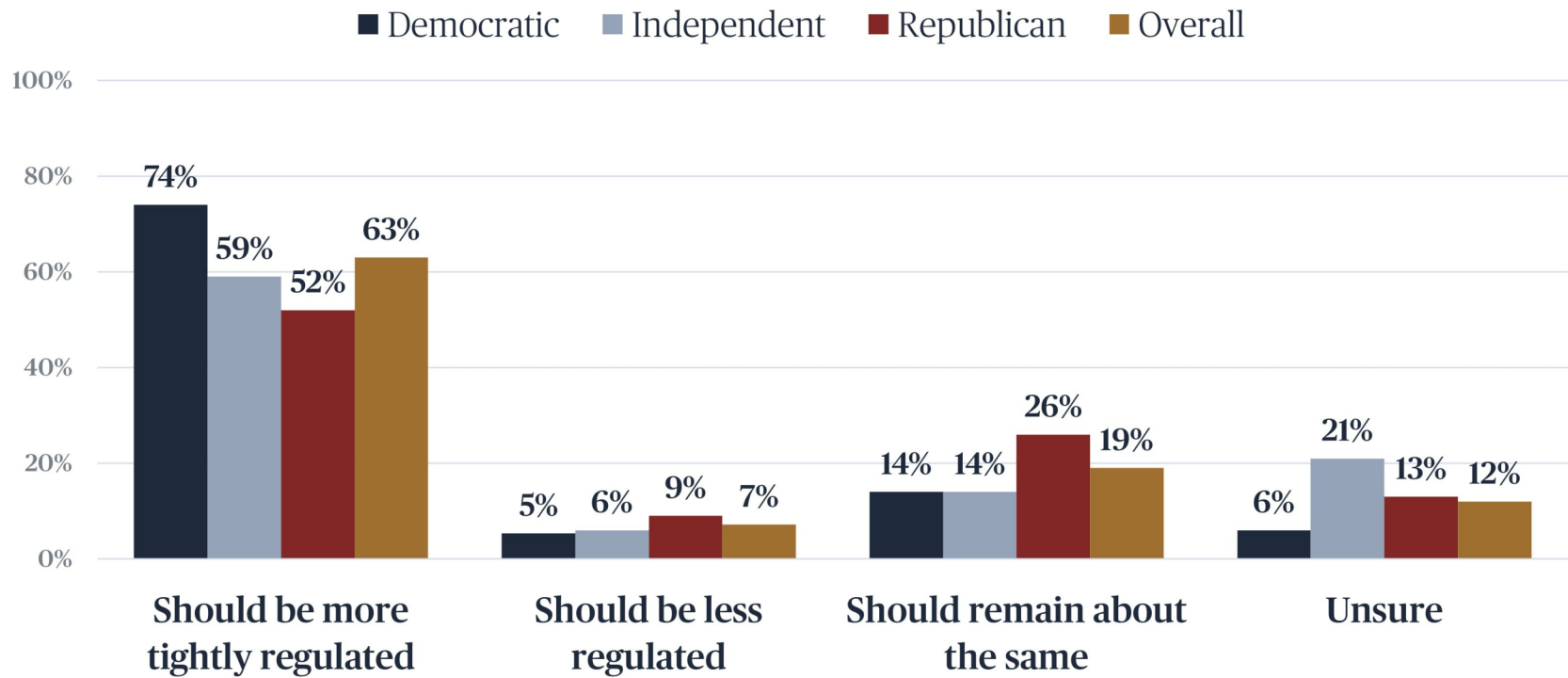


Outlook on the Ability of U.S. Innovation to Address Major Challenges



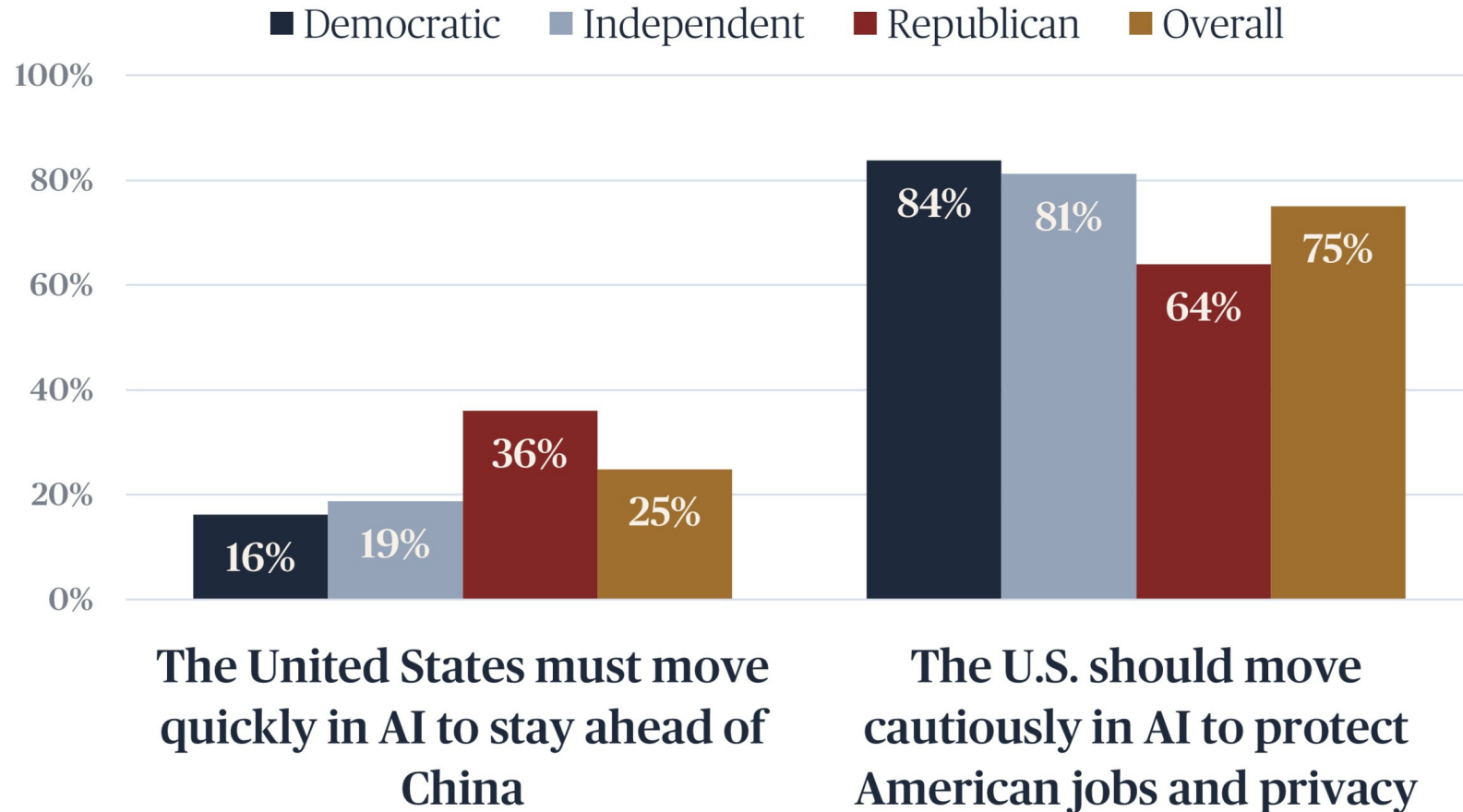

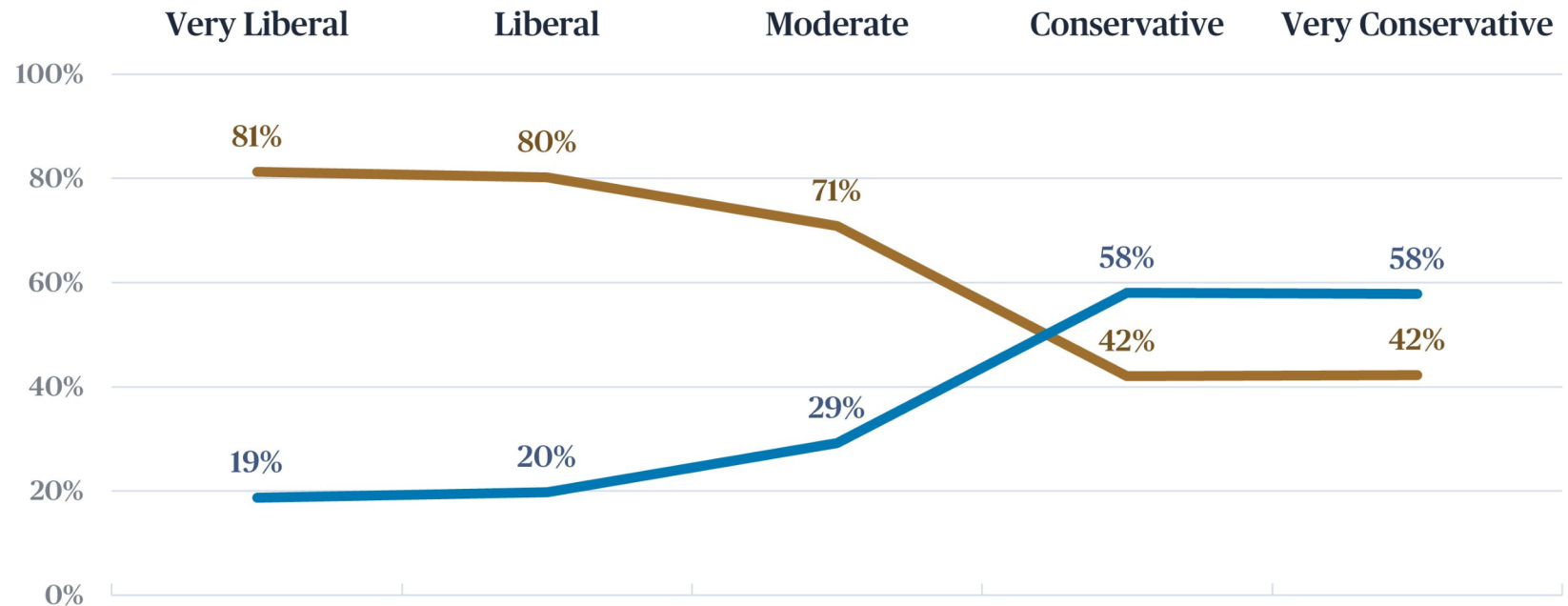

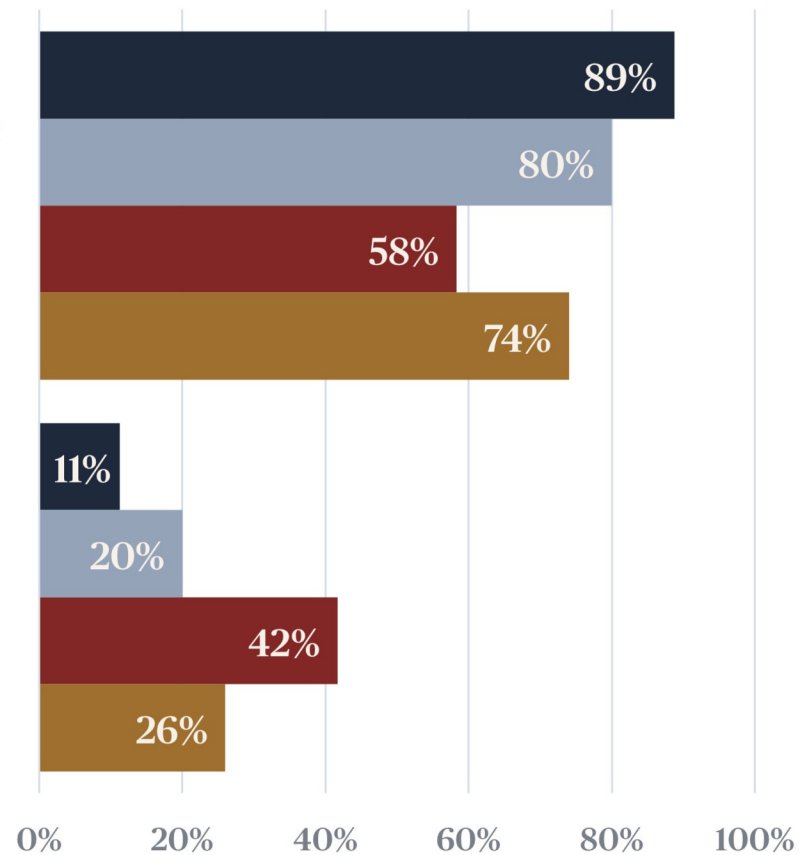

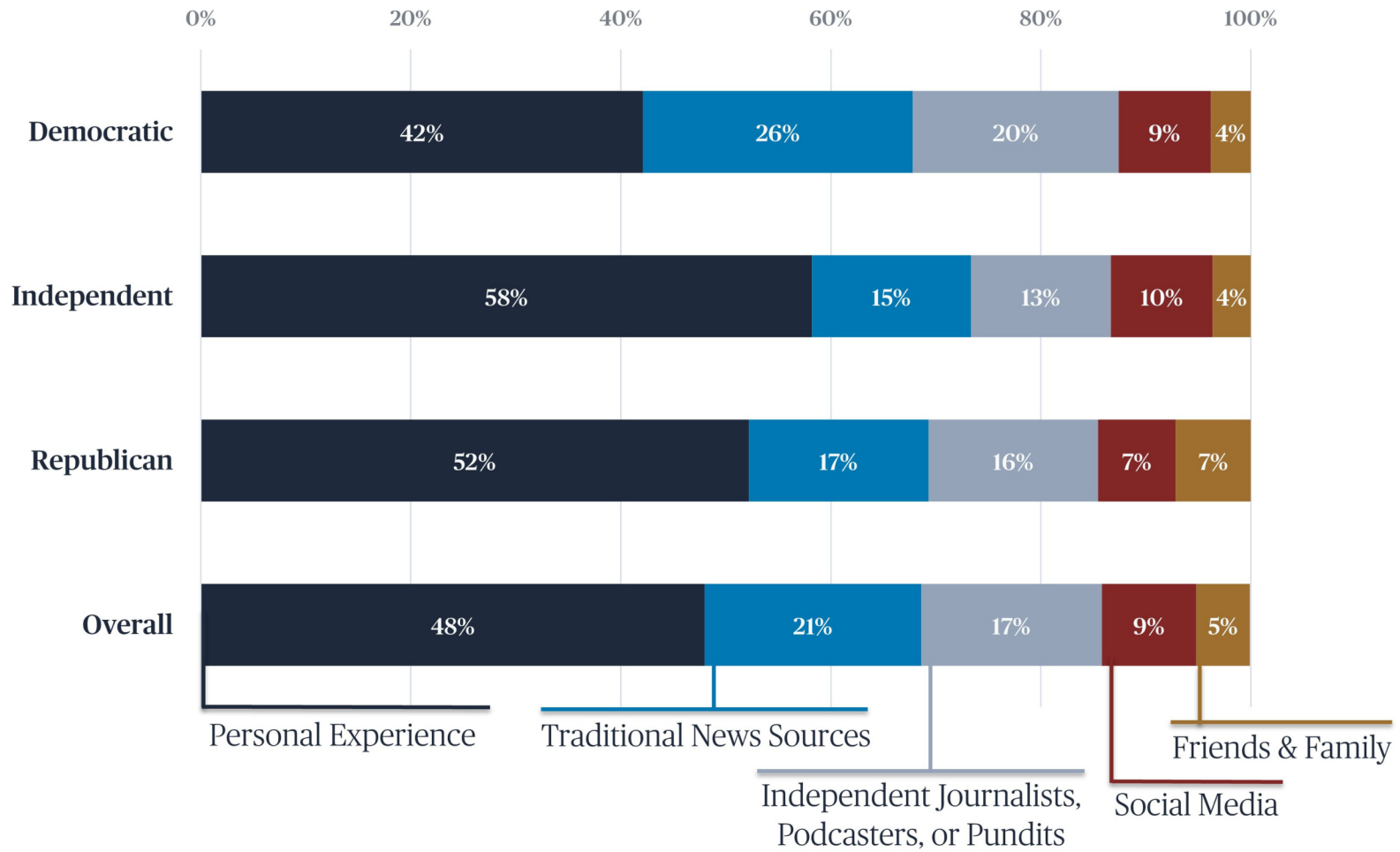

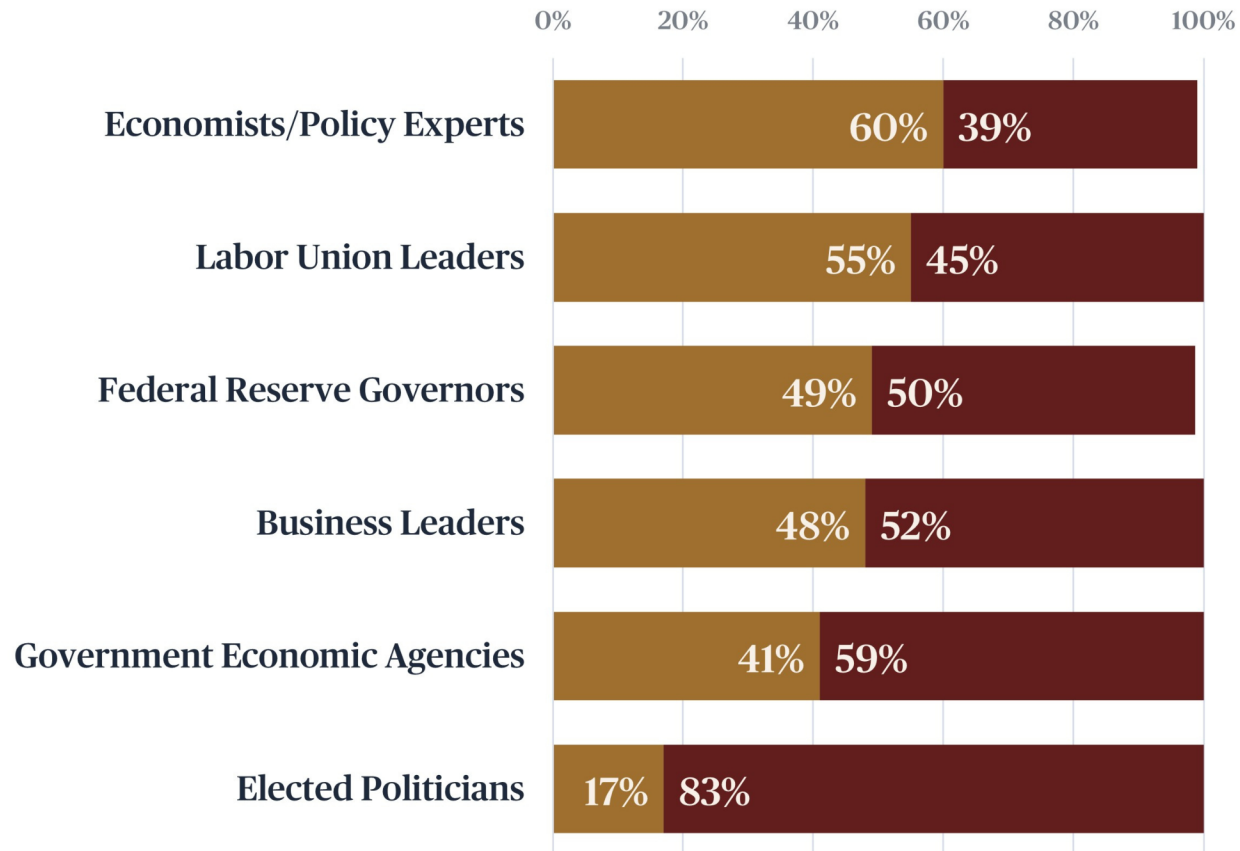


Primary Influence on Economic Perceptions



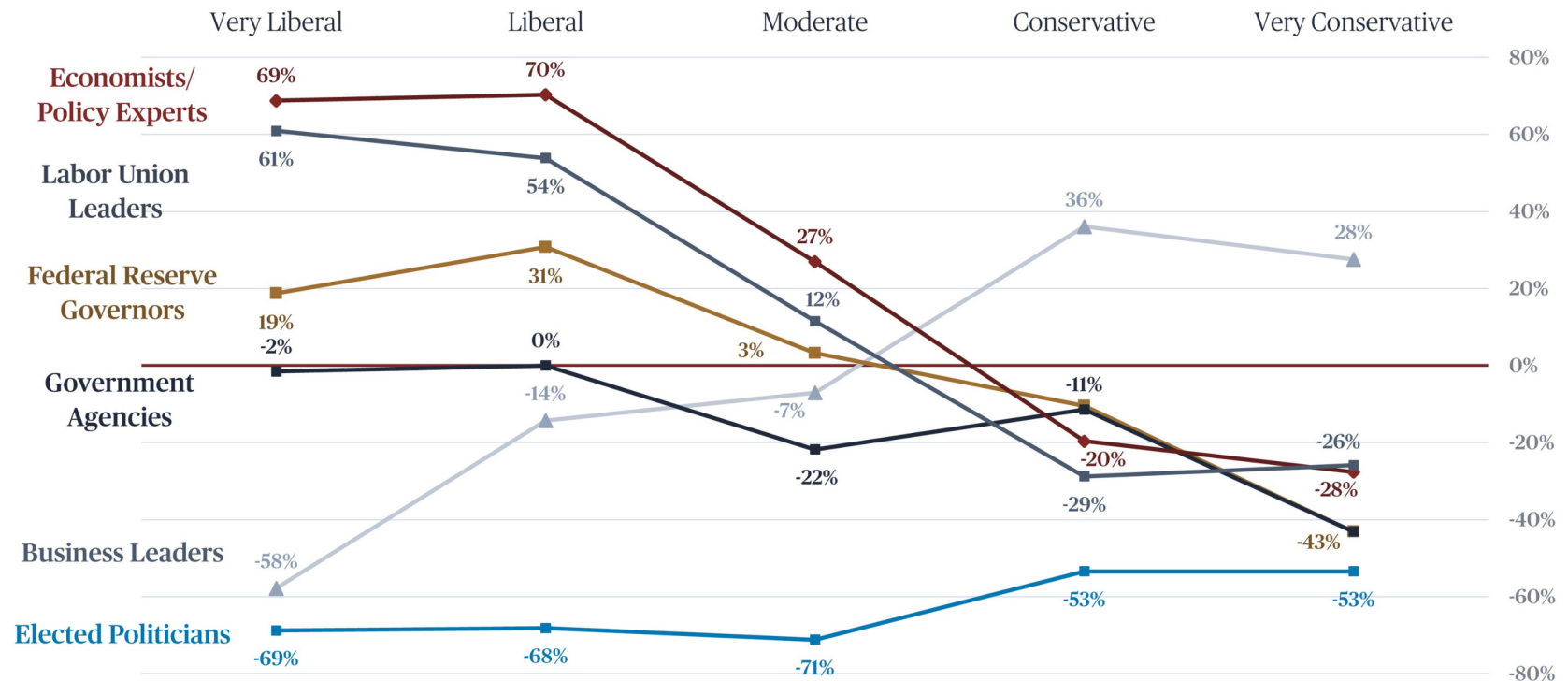

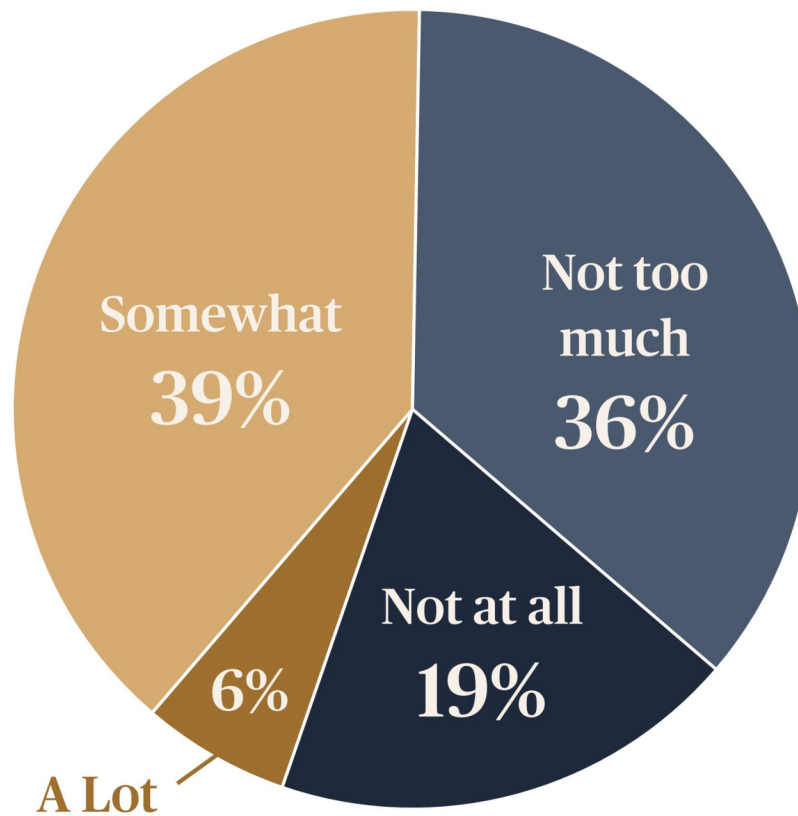
