Thirty-five years ago, *A Nation at Risk*, one of the most significant documents in the history of American public education, was presented to the American people. It challenged Americans to create a Learning Society, “At the heart of such a society is the commitment to a set of values and to a system of education that affords all members the opportunity to stretch their minds to full capacity, from early childhood through adulthood, learning more as the world itself changes.” *A Nation at Risk* argued that education not only created career opportunities, but added to a general quality of life.
