The Ronald Reagan Presidential Foundation and Institute has developed a summer program aimed at increasing the civic engagement of student leaders. This program will develop leadership skills with a goal of accomplishing the following task: identify a problem in the community and create an extensive Leadership Action Plan which details a pathway for addressing that problem.

Sample Schedule

The Ronald Reagan Student Leadership Program – Residential Camp, is a seven-day overnight program, running Sunday – Saturday. Students are required to attend all days of their assigned session and will be housed at scenic California Lutheran University campus in Thousand Oaks. Our overnight option allows students to experience life on a college campus, bond with fellow participants, enjoy team building activities, social events, skill-based workshops, and special guest speakers.
